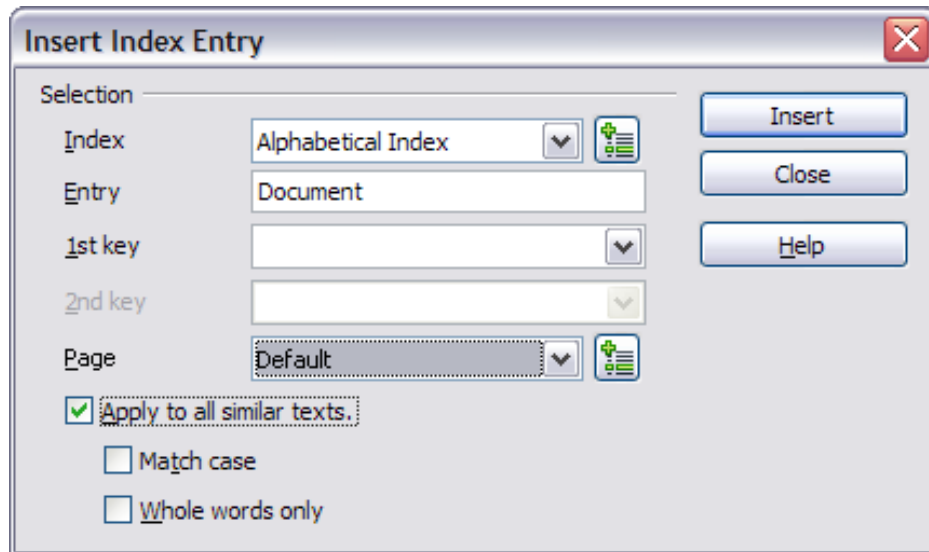

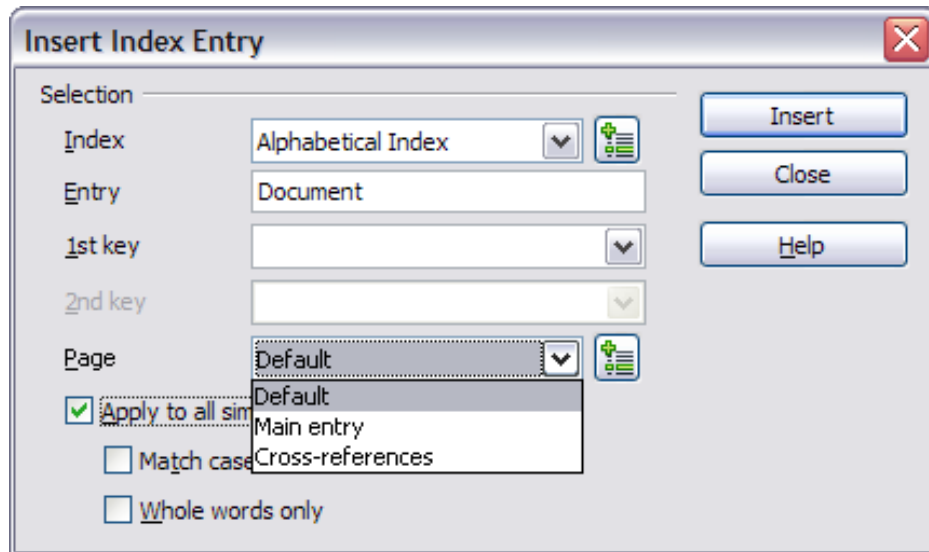

THE MINIMAL INTERVENTION



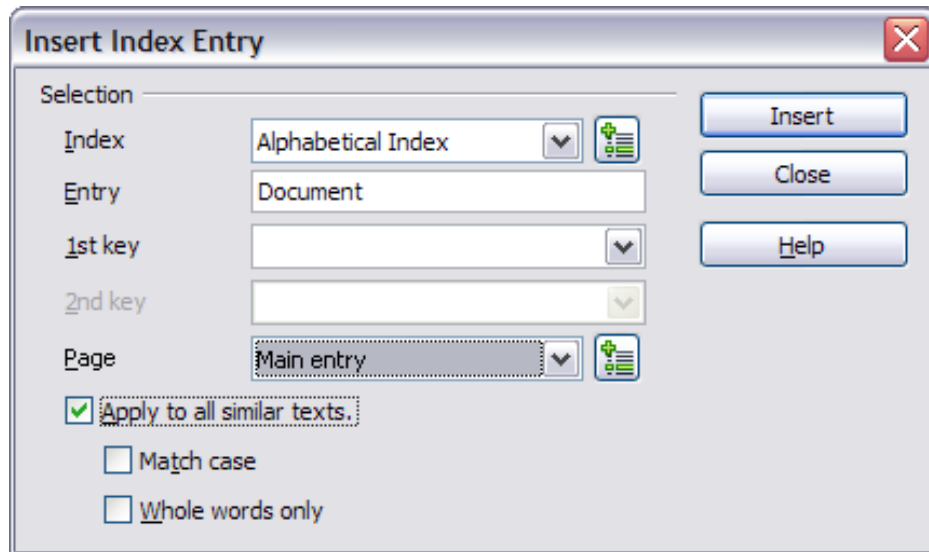
- Replace "main entry" check box with a "options page" drop-down list

NEW INSERT INDEX ENTRY DIALOG-BOX



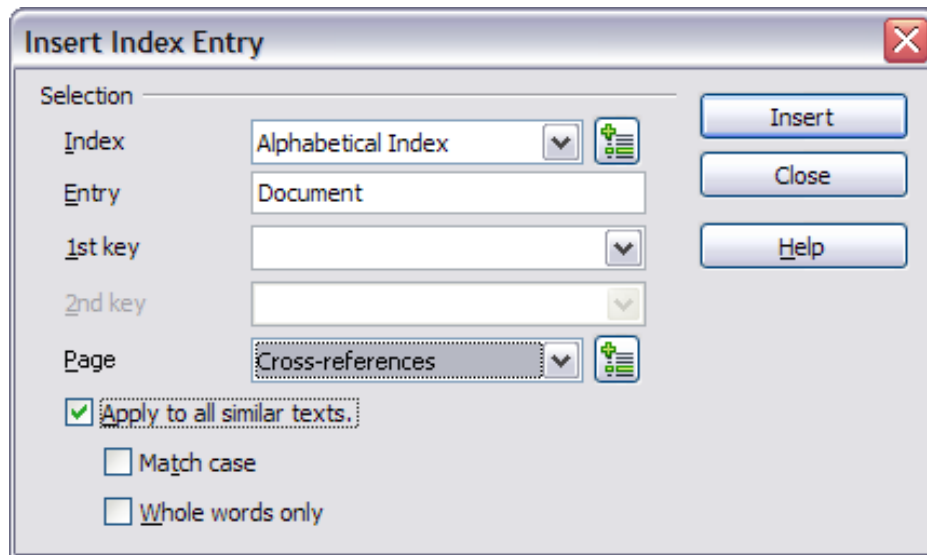
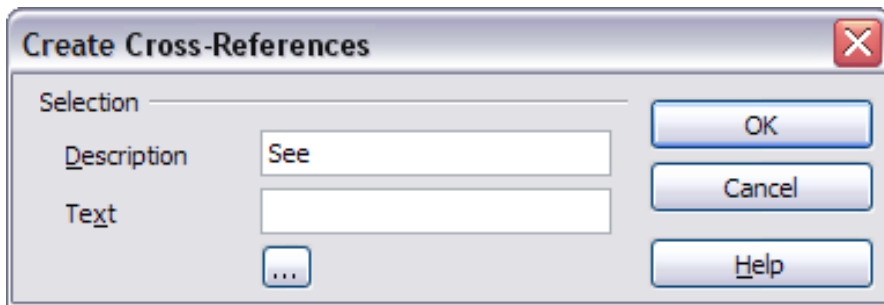
- Drop-down list allows you to choose three options:
- **Default** (default style for the page number)
- **Main entry** (page number style of the main entry)
- **Cross-reference** (allows to include a Cross-reference to an index entry)

NEW INSERT INDEX ENTRY DIALOG-BOX: Main entry



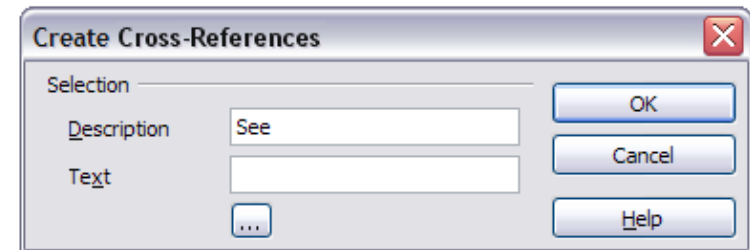
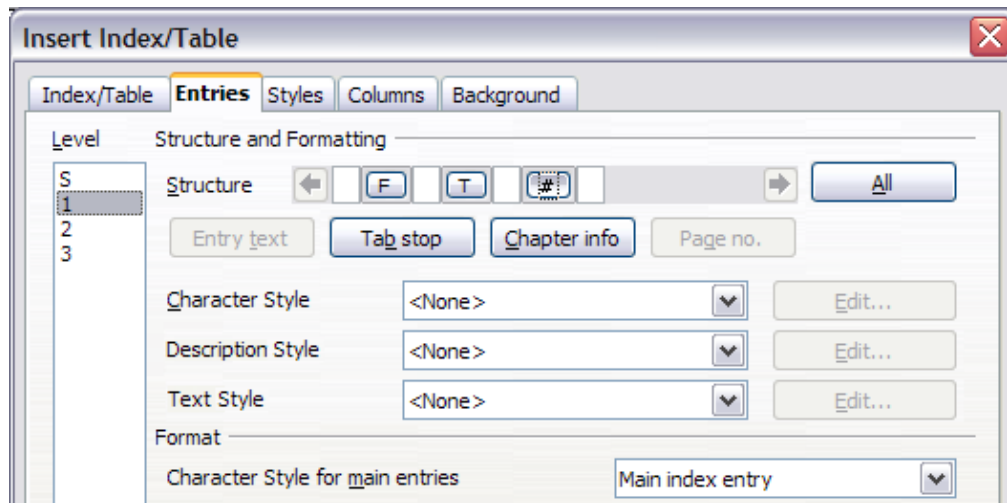
- Allows to mark an entry as main entry

NEW INSERT INDEX ENTRY DIALOG-BOX: Cross-references



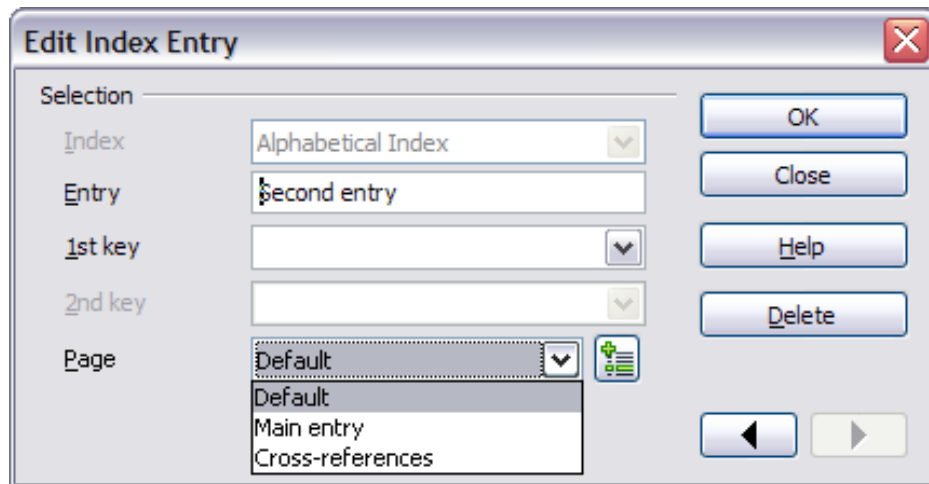
- Select the option “cross-reference” from the drop-down list
- Use the control button on the side of the drop-down list to open the **Create cross-references** dialog-box
- In the window are two text boxes:
- **Description** (lets you insert the reference type: *see*, *see also*, *see table...* or even what you want)
- **Text** (lets you insert a cross-reference to the index entry or keys)
- And the **command button** of “Special Characters window”

NEW INSERT INDEX / TABLE DIALOG-BOX



- The element that represents the page number should now have two new "Character Style" drop-down list.
- **Description Style:** is used to apply the Character Style to the type of cross-reference (*see, see also, see table ...*).
- **Text Style:** is used to apply the Character Style to the cross-reference of the index entries or keys

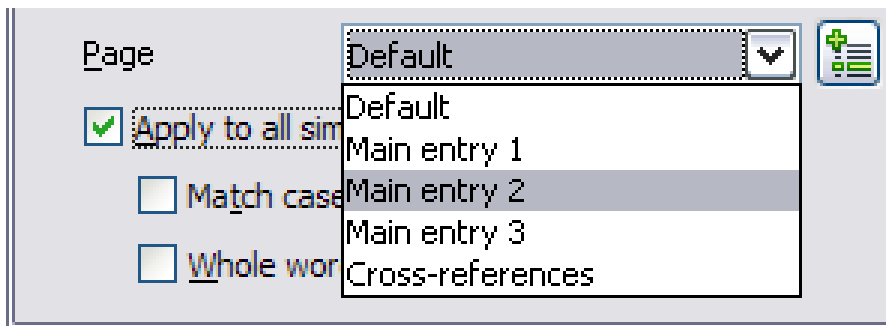
NEW EDIT INDEX ENTRY DIALOG-BOX



- The Edit of the index entry works as now.
- Only two considerations:
- Should be allowed modification of the cross-reference in the two text boxes (Description and Text)
- Should be allowed the complete elimination of the cross-reference by selecting from drop-down list the item Default (or Main entry)

INCREASED FLEXIBILITY

- The solution with the drop-down list allows the future introduction of new features.
- Example:
- More styles of main entry in the same alphabetical index. Such as MS Word (In fact MS Word uses all three styles: **bold**, *italic* and **bold + italic**)
